## PROSECUTING ATTORNEY TO STATE ON RECORD COMPLIANCE WITH MARSY'S LAW

Upon request of the victim, the California Constitution Article I, § 28, section (b), "Marsy's Law," requires the prosecuting agency to confer with a known victim regarding: (1) the arrest of the defendant; (2) the charges filed against the defendant; (3) the determination of whether to extradite the defendant; (4) the right to be notified of and informed before any pretrial disposition of the case; (5) the right to be heard at any proceeding, including any delinquency proceeding, involving a post-arrest release decision, plea, sentencing, post-conviction release decision; and (6) the right to be heard at any proceeding in which a right of the victim is at issue.

Therefore, in any pretrial disposition of a case involving a victim who has been provided rights pursuant to Marsy's Law, the prosecuting attorney shall indicate on the record whether or not the prosecuting agency has complied with the requirements of Marsy's Law, including but not limited to: (1) what specific efforts were undertaken by the prosecuting agency to comply with Marsy's Law; (2) whether or not the victim requested to take part in the disposition of the case; and (3) whether or not the prosecuting agency notified and informed the victim of any pretrial disposition of the case if the victim requested to be notified of such information.
